Personal Hygiene and Responsibility


- Staying Away when Unwell: Students and staff will be reminded to remain at home if they are feeling unwell. (Flu like Symptoms, fever >38 deg)
- Wipe Down Routines: All students will wipe down their desk areas and common/shared equipment each time they need to move to a different classroom/venue.
- Wearing of masks/shields properly: Masks will still be a default protection for all in the BMSS community.
- Clean hands!: Students will be reminded by the school to resume the practice of washing their hands with soap and water on arrival in school, before recess/break time, and after wipedowns. Hand sanitisers will also be available around the school, including classrooms for students to use.

- 1. The Multi-Ministry Taskforce has announced further streamlining of Safe Management Measures (SMMs) and management of positive cases and close contacts on 16 February 2022.
- 2. This letter updates on management of School Attendance and SMMs.

Managing School Attendance as a Ring-fencing Measure

3. Managing school attendance is an important ring-fencing measure that will help keep BMSS students and staff, as well as their families and the larger community safe. Students must inform their Form Teachers if they meet any of the conditions in the table below. They are to fully heed the instructions in the SMMs column. This is aligned to the recent changes announced by the MultiMinistry Taskforce with effect from 16 February 2022.

The following school activities would resume for Sec with effect from **31 Jan 2022**:

- a. <u>Intra-school activities</u> beyond class/CCA, subject to an overall activity cap of 50 persons, in sub-groups of up to 5. This includes intra-level (between classes in a level) and inter-level (across-level) activities.
- b. <u>Inter-school activities</u> with fixed intermingling (i.e. same group of students), subject to an overall activity cap of 50 persons, and aligned to prevailing national sub-group size of 5 (e.g. Strategic Partnership (SP)-CCA, Combined CCAs, HQ Uniform Group activities and Self-Help Groups (SHG) tuition). However, inter-school activities without fixed intermingling (i.e. different groups of students) remain suspended, e.g. CCA friendlies.
- c. <u>External Values-in-Action</u> activities with controlled use of venue (i.e. minimal intermingling with public), subject to an overall activity cap of 50 persons, and aligned to prevailing national sub-group size of 5.

Key SMMs (Assemblies)

Large-scale school activities: Only flag-raising level assemblies may resume with the following parameters:

- A cap of around 300 persons from the same level per venue with 1m safe distancing between all individuals, and zoned by classes with 2m between classes;
- Schools may organize the flag-raising assemblies for different levels each day. Sec schools with large student numbers per level would have to split the level into multiple sessions; and
- Duration should not exceed 30 minutes and all individuals should be masked. Pledge taking and singing of national anthem is permitted. Singing of school song is not permitted.



Key SMMs (Learning Journey)




CCAs held at external venues and learning journeys can proceed with controlled use of venue and with an overall activity cap of 50 persons.

Teachers and students would be subject to external venue's Safe Management Measures (SMMs) and Vaccination Differentiated SMMs (VDS) requirements.





POLYTECHNICS

HOW TO APPLY

Students may apply through:

- * Joint Admission Exercise (JAE);
- * Joint Polytechnic Special Admissions Exercise (JPSAE) for students with special aptitude and talents; or
- * Direct Polytechnic Admission (DPA) Exercise which gives the polytechnic the flexibility to select students based on criteria other than exam results.



TECHNICAL EDUCATION

HOW TO APPLY

- For Nitec courses, students can participate in the Joint Intake Exercises (JIE) conducted by ITE.
- * For Higher Nitec courses, students can take part in the Joint Admission Exercise (JAE).

From 2024, students applying for admissions to the polytechnics will generally need to meet three subject-specific MERs (Minimum Entry Requirements)

- In general, the subject-specific MERs will comprise three subjects*:
 - EL a. English Language
 - R2 b. Two relevant subjects drawn from the R subject list for the associated course type

^{*} Exceptions may be made in special circumstances, especially for regulated courses with specific requirements

Clarification #1

Now there is fewer subjects that I need to meet grade requirements, is it easier for me to enter the polytechnics?

- As the subject-specific MERs will be more aligned to the R subjects lists, you will need to <u>do well in the R</u> <u>subjects to be eligible for the course</u>, and also obtain a net ELR2B2 aggregate score of <u>26 points or better</u> for non-Nursing courses. For example, you will need to do well in your science subjects for courses in category C.
- Admissions will continue to be based on merit in open competition with other applicants, as well as available vacancies in each course.

Clarification #2

There is still a lot of time and I do not need to look at the subject-specific MERs now?

- You are encouraged to look at the polytechnic course requirements for the courses you are interested in, to have a better understanding of what the courses require.
- You may wish to choose your subject combination based on the course requirements. You should take into consideration your interests and aptitude in your secondary school subjects as well.

GCE 'O'/'N' Level Preparation

- 2 year of journey of preparation and examination
- Focus on rigour in subjects especially English Language & Mathematics
- Increased width and level of difficulty of subjects (eg coursework and pure sciences)
- New subjects and strong foundation is important for examination success.






